Also there was a period in 2014 when DBS's were not recorded by Gilwell, so you may think your is current but Gilwell have no record of this. The easiest way to resolve this is to complete a new check.

On a sad note we have said goodbye to the 5-a-side football as this wasn't very well supported, so can I ask you to support all the events this year because we could lose some of these.

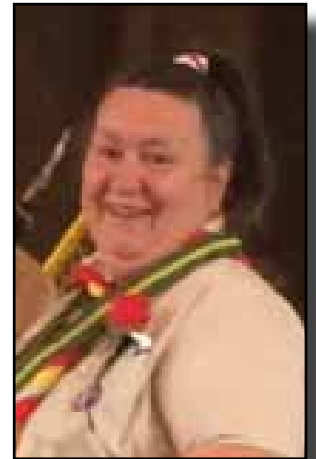
