The same seven, have now started silver and hopefully by April 2017 will have completed. We are very excited, by the way out young members have embraced this, they are soaking up everything we offer them, and it is a privilege, watching them grow, and find their way in life.

Some of you may be unaware that the DofE and our chief scouts award are so closely linked that it is virtually impossible to gain one without the other, so it was with a great sense of pride that I got to see the first ever (so I'm told) Platinum awards for Barking and Dagenham being this week at Gilwell. Your explorers work very hard for the awards, and to witness the presentation, for me is truly humbling, and makes it all worthwhile. There are more Explorers due to complete their awards very soon.

Silver DofE, brings with it a Diamond award, and there are currently seven members working toward Diamond. If they complete within the next year, then they will go on to Gold, and of course the big one, A Queens Scout Award, and although they could not possibly finish a QSA in the explorer section, they could be a third of the way through, when they move on, and I believe they have the drive and commitment to do it too.

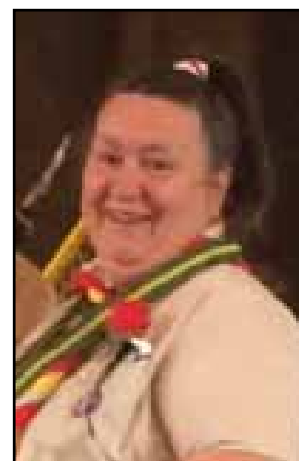




# Cub Capers
