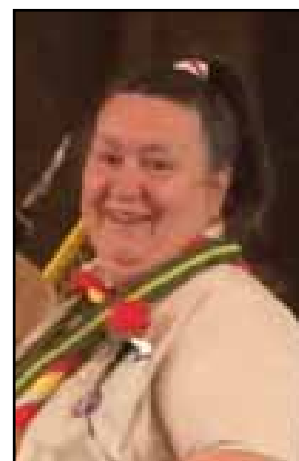
Cub Capers

Waltham Walk 2016

Four Explorers (and Riff-Raff) from Barking and Dagenham took part in this year's walk in Danbury, it is a gruelling two day incident hike, organised and run by the Boys Brigade.

The competition is open to all youth groups and has two categories, a mini trek for 12 to 14 year olds, in which the youngsters navigate with a day sack around a slightly smaller course.



The main event is for 14 to 18 year olds, and scouts put their skills against, the boy's brigade and air/army groups too, it has been running now for forty years, and is well attended. It consists of an incident hike, carrying all of your kit for the weekend, clothes, tent, cooker and food, very much like a Bronze DofE , except it is over timed checkpoints, each with an incident, 16 miles the first day and 7 miles the second.... Yes miles.

Each checkpoint is secret and the next is written up when the competitors arrive at the destination, there is no fixed route, so they can hike their own way, providing they stay away from 'A' roads and larger 'B' roads. On arrival they have an incident to complete, in which they score points, but they can decline if they wish, significantly, the bases are fairly simple, but not after walking three miles to get to them. It is a very well thought out competition.

So, our young members.....

The weekend started with a 6.15 pickup outside St Cedds from there we travelled to Danbury, our first team The Columbus 'Clumsies' due out at 8.20am (I named them,

hee hee) Dan Warrington fancied taking a look at the competition for his scouts, so we coerced him into driving them up, while I took the kit

The weekend's food was distributed, between them, tents separated, and spread between them to lighten the load, the group were given a Trangia, fuel and a first aid kit to carry too, and then they were set and ready to go.....

The timed point to point hike, soon took its toll on all competitors, and as points were deducted per minute for lateness, there was no time to stop, and thinking and navigating 'on the move' was the only way to compete, checkpoints ranged from assault courses, to river-ford crossings, to jigsaw puzzles.

Each base became harder as fatigue set in, as simple as they were, if of course you are just observing the race. As most of you will understand, getting yourself back together to set up and cook after such a day extremely difficult,

A good night's sleep prevailed, and the leaders awoke fresh and ready to motivate! Our young members, arose and cooked a nice breakfast of bacon rolls and pancakes, struck camp and had their sites inspected, as all camping skills were monitored for points, during their stay, and were ready to be motivated..... After an inspirational talk, by me! you know the one. The explorers were ready to crack on, with a nasty twist in store for them, last in had to leave first, so the quicker ones, on the



previous day, were rewarded with a longer rest.... Cruel, very cruel.

The second day was as the first, a further 7 miles, of incidents, not just at bases!

The 'Clumsies' came 5th overall, and won a trophy for the highest scoring mixed gender group. A special mention for our George who teamed up with his explorer friends from Essex, as he did last year and

they finished a very impressive third overall.
